RIBA COMES HOME

Acclaimed Indian architect Balkrishna Doshi has been awarded the Royal Gold Medal 2022, one of the world's highest honours for architecture.

BV Doshi has been awarded the Royal Institute of British Architects's Royal Gold Medal for 2022. Given in recognition of a lifetime's work, the Royal Gold Medal is approved personally by Her Majesty The Queen and is given to a person or group of people who have had a significant influence on the advancement of architecture. The Royal Institute of British Architects is a global professional membership body driving excellence in architecture. The RIBA was founded in 1834 for 'the general advancement of Architecture, and for promoting and facilitating the acquirement of the knowledge of the various arts and sciences connected therewith'. Originally named the Institute of British Architects in London, it was formed in 1834 by several prominent architects, including Decimus Burton, Philip Hardwick, Thomas Allom, William Donthorne, Thomas Leverton Donaldson, William Adams Nicholson, John Buonarotti Papworth, and Thomas de Grey, 2nd Earl de Grey. The latter served as the institute's first president for 25 years until his death in 1859.

Remembering architect Oscar Niemeyer on his birth anniversary.

Oscar Niemeyer was a Brazilian architect known for the development of modern architecture. Niemeyer was best known for his design of civic buildings for Brasília, a planned city that became Brazil's capital in 1960, as well as his collaboration with other architects on the headquarters of the United Nations in New York. He was born in the city of Rio de Janeiro on December 15, 1907. Niemeyer studied architecture at the National School of Fine Arts, Rio de Janeiro. Shortly before he graduated in 1934, he entered the office of Lúcio Costa, a leader of the Modernist movement in Brazilian architecture.

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
