

Yayoi Kusama is a world famous artist now best known for her Infinity Mirror Rooms. Kusama primarily worked in sculpture and installation, but made a prolific name in the world of painting, performance, film, fashion, poetry, fiction, and other arts.

She was raised in Matsumoto, and trained at the Kyoto School of Arts and Crafts in a traditional Japanese painting style called nihonga. Kusama was inspired, however, by American Abstract impressionism. She moved to New York City in 1958 and was a part of the New York avant-garde scene throughout the 1960s, especially in the pop-art movement. Embracing the rise of the hippie counterculture of the late 1960s, she came to public attention when she organized a series of happenings in which naked participants were painted with brightly colored polka dots.
